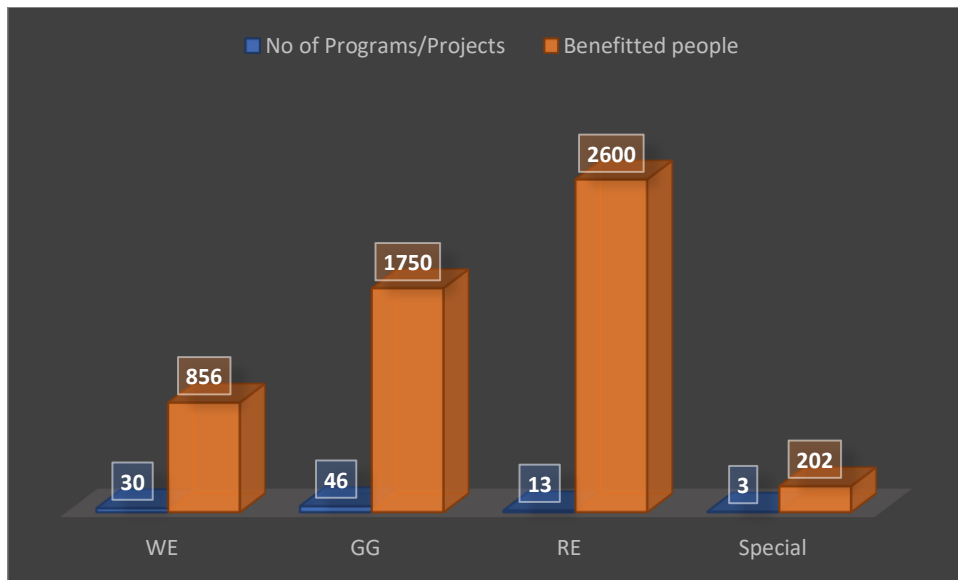


been making serious efforts on training & Extension of rural youths and women in income generation activities using local resources and relevant technologies in the field.

BVT organised two financial literacy awareness programs at Dakshina Kannada Dist. Seventy-four people benefitted from the program.



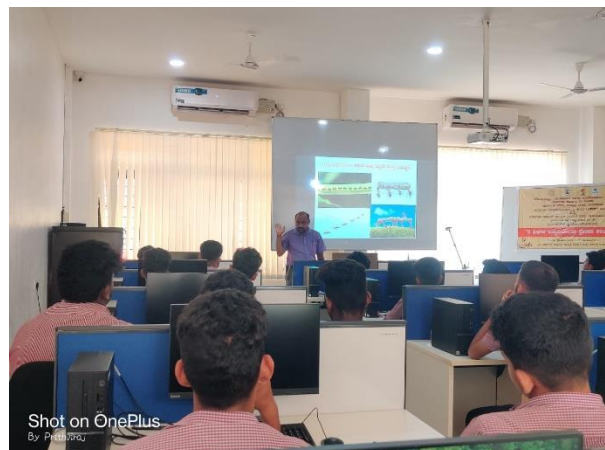
Training Program for NGO's Staffs

Renewable Energy and FIs

Renewable energy is a clean energy source with a significantly lower environmental impact compared to fossil fuels. Derived from natural sources like sunlight, wind, and water, renewable energy replenishes itself without depleting the planet's resources. Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT) is actively promoting renewable energy through various programs, focusing on training and capacity building for rural youth and entrepreneurs.

Since 1996, BVT has recognized the potential of solar energy to provide sustainable power to rural India. With support from the REPSO office of Winrock International India, BVT established a solar park to demonstrate this technology's potential. They have also launched training programs to facilitate youth in accessing commercial bank loans for solar systems. Providing electricity is crucial for poverty alleviation, as many households without reliable electricity remain economically disadvantaged.

BVT has extensive experience with renewable energy technologies like solar and biogas and has pioneered efforts to bring these technologies to un-electrified areas, particularly in Dakshin Kannada and Udupi Districts. BVT's initiatives have linked financial institutions with solar service providers, fostering a new growth story in the country's renewable energy sector.

Training on Solar Technician & Solar Service Entrepreneurs in Karnataka



There is a strong need for a timely solar service network that can deliver energy technology and solutions to the end-user and help in greater adoption by ensuring after-sales maintenance systems are available to the end-user, locally. The creation of ‘Solar Business cum service entrepreneurs and Technicians’ is the need of the hour to strengthen the last mile energy sector.

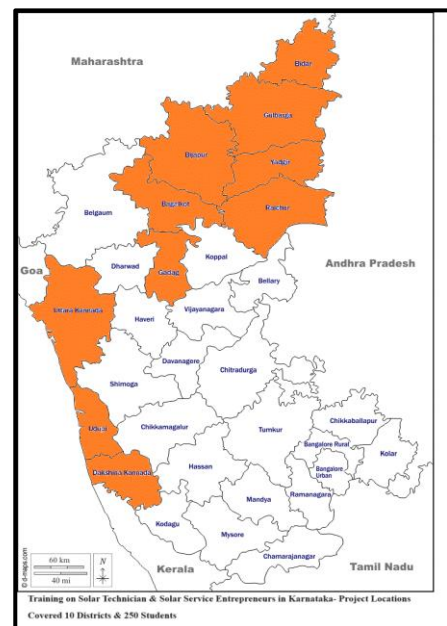
Technology adoption has increased with more innovations in the sector and with more NGOs and government affiliated agencies reaching out to the last mile to deliver the solution and transform the markets for solar PV in those areas. However, for long term sustainability, it is critical to build capacity of grassroots level individuals who can transform themselves into a business-cum-service entrepreneurs for renewable energy solutions and efficient appliances.

Methodology/Objectives:

- The project aims to Train and build the capacities of Technicians- servicepreneurs to ensure working Performance and deliver DRE- Solar energy-based solutions – Efforts to establish a trained & Professional green energy (DRE solutions) workforce in the districts of Karnataka State.
- About 500 youths, students, and others are trained as a Solar Technicians on installation, repair, service and maintenance services as to ensure the working performance of DRE based – Solar systems solar-sustainable energy solutions.

Organised 10 programs at Udupi, Yadgiri, Gadag, Vijayapura, Raichur, Dakshina Kannada, Kalburgi, Bagalkot, Bidar & Uttar Kannada Districts. Total 250 candidates successfully completed the training program.



The duration of the program was 6 days of which 2 days for basic theoretical and 2 days for practical/demonstration simulation-based sessions, 2 Days will be exclusively devoted to field exposures where in participants exposed to actual installations and Service process -field based training environment.

Swavalamban Challenge Fund (SCF) Window -I - SIDBI

BVT is implemented a project to provide and improve livelihoods of rural entrepreneurs through decentralized solar energy solutions in Karnataka sponsored by Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) under its Swavalamban Challenge Fund (SCF) Window -I.

To achieve the above objective, as per the operational modalities, we are organising different awareness cum training programs at the operational areas- Haveri, Koppal, Raichur and Yadgiri districts for



facilitating access to about 150 DRE based livelihood solutions/ installations.

Under this project, organised 12 Partner organisation Awareness Programs, 24 Financial Institution Awareness Programs & 8 Skill Training on Tailoring and Aari embroidery program at Haveri, Koppal, Raichur and Yadgiri districts and covered 1500+ people.

Solar Livelihood Products Training for Engineering Students

Organised a one-day awareness program for engineering students at B-SAFE, Centre for Excellence, BVT, Manipal. The program covered topics such as introduction to semiconductors and various types of semiconductor materials, various types of solar panels and their manufacturing, photovoltaics, charge regulators, inverters, batteries, different



types of lights, solar street lights, various solar-based livelihood products, their workings and benefits, current challenges in solar energy, future challenges and technologies in solar energy, the effect of solar energy on the environment, and the benefits of sustainable energy. A total of 11 students participated in the session.

Awareness Program on Renewable Energy, Solid Waste Management and Rainwater Harvesting

MGIRE (Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Rural Energy and Development) and BVT organised one day awareness program on “Renewable Energy, Solid Waste Management and Rainwater Harvesting” at Varambally, Kokkarne, Billadi, Koteswara and Vakvadi village. The program covered Renewable Energy, Solid Waste Management and Rainwater Harvesting” sessions.

Ltd., Udupi District (Session on Solar Livelihood). SHGs members and local community people were actively participated in the programs. Five programs covered 400 people.

E-bicycle Charging Station at Sohra, Meghalaya

In an effort to boost tourism in Meghalaya, an innovative e-cycle charging station service has been launched at Sohra, Meghalaya. The initiative is a collaborative project between Bharathiya Vikas Trust, Manipal, and Cini Tata Trust, Jamshedpur. The program was inaugurated by Gavin Migen Myliam, the MLA of West Khasi Hills District, who emphasized the project's potential to significantly enhance tourism in Sohra village and benefit visitors.



Blockchain for Indian Public Health

BVT plans to implement sustainable energy (Solar Energy) based solutions along with infrastructure improvement at required sites in the Thotlavalluru village.

The interventions aim to:

1. **Solar Energy Access:** Provide reliable and sustainable solar energy solutions for School, Anganwadi & Health Centre facilities in Thotlavalluru village.
2. **Infrastructure Development:** Improve key infrastructure elements, including playground, street lighting, sanitation and water supply to enhance overall living conditions.
3. **Community Empowerment:** Empower the community through capacity building initiatives, ensuring local involvement and sustainability.

Project Impact:

1. Through the program, including all the villages, a population of 8000 and households 1800 and students 650 will be benefitted.
2. The project will impact 1 rural schools & 4 Anganwadi centres by introducing modern teaching methodologies and solar inverter-based system in the classroom.
3. Through the project 20 street lighting system will be implemented leading to the encouragement for sports activity post sunset.

Demand for coconut shell tricolour badges on the rise

Mangaluru: With a commitment to eco-friendliness, women from the Mahalingeshwara Sanjeevini Okkoota, in Kodimbadu in Puttur are actively engaged in crafting mini-tricolour badges using coconut shells.

As the country is gearing up to celebrate its 77th Independence Day, there is a growing demand for these badges, said Sandhya Ramachandra Gowda, master book keeper of the Okkoota project in charge.

She told TOI that the women from the Okkoota, under the National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM), showed interest in acquiring new skills and opportunities to earn. "Since most of the women come from agricultural backgrounds and this is a coconut producing belt, women were trained by NABARD, Bharatya Vikas Trust, Manipal, and South Canara Coconut Farmers Producers' Company Ltd, Vitta to make various items from

coconut shells, including key chains, pen stands, tea cups and so on. Interestingly after viewing instructional videos on YouTube, a handful of women are now venturing into creating and trying out new products," she said.

On the mini-tricolour badges, Sandhya said three teams are working on the project and they have already sold 150 badges and another batch of 60 badges is expected

to be ready by the end of the day. Each badge is priced at Rs 25, is 1.5 inches long and one inch wide, and can be pinned to clothes. As news of their efforts is being circulated, more individuals are reaching out to the team for badges.

"Crafting these badges involves significant labour and tricolour stickers are affixed onto rectangular coconut shells. Other than badges, there's a noteworthy demand for other handicrafts made from coconut shells, including keychains, planters, mementoes, and tea cups. Hotels in particular have shown interest in the purchase of coconut shell tea cups, although the primary challenge lies in creating cups of consistent size. Once the women enhance their skills, the administration plans to explore more structured avenues for marketing these products," she said.

After Independence Day, the women will be dedicating their efforts to make raksha bandhans from coconut shells.
