Women Empowerment & Education



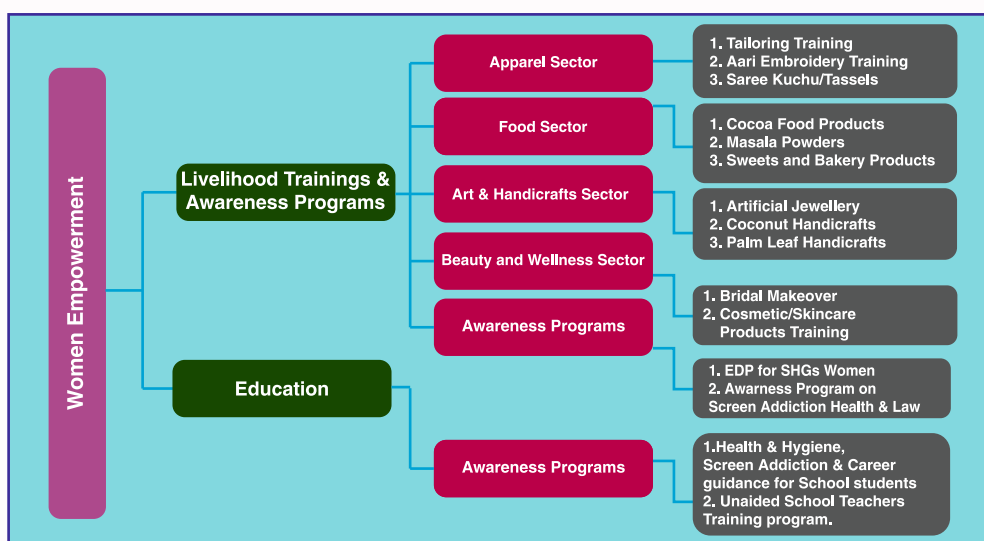
Empowering women is not just about providing opportunities—it's about equipping them with the skills, knowledge, and confidence to shape their own futures. Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with esteemed partners like Robosoft Technologies, Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF), NABARD, and others, has undertaken a comprehensive initiative aimed at uplifting rural women across Udupi, Dakshina Kannada, and surrounding districts through targeted livelihood training and awareness programs.

With a focus on creating sustainable livelihood opportunities, BVT has implemented a wide range of skill development programs across various sectors including apparel, food processing, art and handicrafts, and beauty and wellness. From tailoring and Aari embroidery to the crafting of artificial jewelry and eco-friendly coconut shell products, women have been trained in both traditional and contemporary skills, enabling them to generate income while preserving cultural heritage. These programs have benefitted over a thousand women, many of whom are now stepping into roles as entrepreneurs and skilled artisans within their communities.

In addition to economic empowerment, BVT has prioritized awareness and education, especially among school students and rural communities. Through sessions on adolescent health, screen addiction, career guidance, women's legal rights, and hygiene, the organization has reached thousands, fostering healthier lifestyles and more informed decision-making.

Together, these initiatives form a holistic approach to women empowerment—one that nurtures self-reliance, dignity, and long-term growth, while also building stronger, more resilient communities.

ACTIVITIES - Livelihood Training & Awareness Programs

• Apparel Sector

Skill Training in Tailoring/Dress Designing

Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Robosoft Technologies and Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF), organized nine skill training programs in tailoring and dress designing across various locations in Udupi and Dakshina Kannada districts. These programs aimed to empower rural women by enhancing their skills and promoting self-employment opportunities. A total of 311 women from rural areas successfully completed the training and benefitted from the initiative.



Skill Training in Aari Embroidery



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF) and Manipal Payment and Identity Solutions (MPIS), successfully organized 10 skill training programs on Aari Embroidery across various locations in Udupi and Dakshina Kannada districts. These programs aimed to empower rural women by equipping them with traditional embroidery skills that can enhance their livelihood opportunities. A total of 301 rural women participated and benefitted from the training, gaining hands-on experience and knowledge in Aari Embroidery, which can serve as a source of income and self-reliance.

Skill Training in Saree Tassels/ Saree Kuchu

Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF) and Saphalya Trust, organized three skill training programs on Saree Tassels (Saree Kuchu) in Udupi and Dakshina Kannada districts. These trainings aimed to empower rural women by teaching them the traditional art of enhancing sarees with decorative tassels, thereby opening up avenues for self-employment and income generation. A total of 116 rural women benefitted from the program, gaining valuable skills to support their livelihoods through creative and culturally rooted craftsmanship.



• Food Sector

Skill Training in Food Products



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with NABARD (National Bank for Agriculture & Rural Development), Robosoft Technologies, and Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF), organized 7 skill training programs on the preparation of various food products such as chocolates, bakery items, curry masala powders, and more. These programs were conducted across different locations in Udupi and Dakshina Kannada districts with the aim of enhancing rural women's entrepreneurial skills in food processing. A total of 214 rural women benefitted from the training, gaining practical knowledge to support income generation through small-scale food enterprises.

• Art and Handicrafts Sector

Skill Training in Artificial Jewellery

Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with NABARD (National Bank for Agriculture & Rural Development), Robosoft Technologies, and Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF), conducted 6 skill training programs on Artificial Jewellery across various locations in Hassan, Udupi, and Dakshina Kannada districts. These programs were designed to empower rural women by providing them with practical skills in designing and crafting artificial jewellery. A total of 175 women participated in the training and benefitted from the opportunity to enhance their income-generating capabilities through creative and sustainable livelihoods.



Skill Training in Coconut Shell Handicrafts



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Robosoft Technologies and Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), organized two skill training programs on Coconut Shell Handicrafts at Mullikatte, Hosadu, Baidoor in Udupi District and at KVK, Mangalore in Dakshina Kannada District. The training aimed to promote rural entrepreneurship by teaching participants the art of creating eco-friendly and marketable products from coconut shells. A total of 60 rural women benefitted from the program, gaining creative skills and knowledge to explore sustainable livelihood opportunities.

Skill Training in Palm Leaf Handicrafts Products

Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with NABARD (National Bank for Agriculture & Rural Development), organized a skill training program on Palm Leaf Handicraft Products at Siddakatte, Bantwal in Dakshina Kannada District. The training focused on imparting traditional crafting techniques using palm leaves to promote sustainable livelihoods and preserve indigenous art forms. A total of 30 rural women benefitted from the program, gaining hands-on skills and knowledge to create eco-friendly handicraft items for income generation.



• Beauty and Wellness Sector

Skill Training in Bridal Makeover



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Robosoft Technologies and Manipal Payment and Identity Solutions (MPIS), organized two skill training programs in Bridal Makeover at Taluk Panchayat, Kaup in Udupi District, and VIRAT, Surathkal in Dakshina Kannada District. These programs were designed to empower rural women by providing them with practical skills in bridal makeup and beauty techniques. A total of 69 rural women benefitted from the training, gaining valuable knowledge and hands-on experience to pursue income-generating opportunities in the beauty and wellness industry.

Skill Training in Skincare Products



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF) and Robosoft Technologies, organized five skill training programs on Skincare Products in Udupi District. The training aimed to equip rural women with the knowledge and practical skills to prepare a variety of natural and homemade skincare products. These programs provided a platform for women to explore entrepreneurship in the beauty and wellness sector. A total of 163 rural women benefitted from the training, gaining valuable skills to support self-employment and income generation.

• Awareness Programs

Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP) Training for SHGs Members



BVT with a collaboration of Women and Child Development Department, Udupi organised one day EDP training for SHGs women at BVT Campus. 80 SHGs women benefitted.

Awareness Program on Screen Addiction, Law, Health & Hygiene



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Robosoft Technologies, organized 12 awareness programs on Screen Addiction, Women & Law, and Health & Hygiene at various locations across Udupi District. These programs aimed to educate and sensitize rural communities on the impact of excessive screen usage, legal rights and protections for women, and the importance of maintaining personal and community hygiene. A total of 489 rural people benefitted from these sessions, gaining essential knowledge to lead healthier, safer, and more informed lives

ACTIVITIES - Education

Awareness Programs for School Students/ Adolescents



BVT, in collaboration with Robosoft Technologies, Udupi, successfully conducted awareness programs on Adolescent Health, Screen Addiction, and Career Guidance across various schools in Udupi District. Resource persons from SDM Ayurveda College Udyavara, delivered insightful sessions tailored to students, addressing key aspects of adolescent health for both boys and girls. Topics included menstruation, menstrual hygiene, healthy lifestyle practices, and nutrition, aiming to equip students with essential knowledge on maintaining health and hygiene. Additionally, Professionals from Dr. AV Baliga College, Doddanagudde, conducted sessions on the impact of screen addiction on adolescents, while Lecturers from DIET, Udupi provided career guidance to help students make informed decisions about their future. BVT organized a total of 46 programs, including 17 sessions on adolescent health, 13 on screen addiction, and 16 on career guidance, benefiting 3,708 students.

Teachers Training Program for Unaided School Teachers

BVT with a collaboration of DIET and Education Department Udupi organised teachers training program for unaided school teachers. 55 unaided school teachers from 26 schools participated.



Good Governance



The Good Governance sector at Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT) is dedicated to promoting transparency, accountability, and participatory development by empowering individuals and institutions at the grassroots level. Through a range of targeted programs and collaborative efforts with esteemed partners, BVT aims to build the capacities of rural communities, enhance public awareness, and support inclusive decision-making processes.

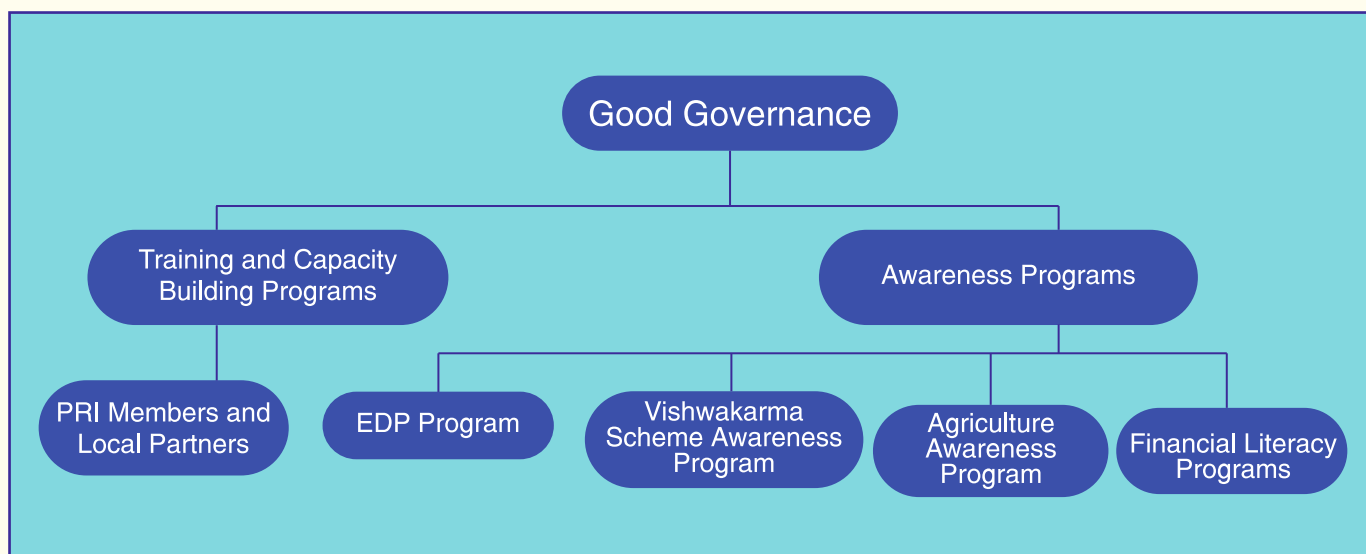
Key initiatives in this sector include Entrepreneurship Development Programs in partnership with the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development of Karnataka (CEDOK), which foster entrepreneurial thinking and skill-building among aspiring individuals. BVT has also conducted widespread awareness campaigns on the Vishwakarma Scheme, educating traditional artisans and craftsmen about available government support for their livelihoods.

Furthering its commitment to sustainable development, BVT facilitated fruit plant distribution with Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) to promote agro-based income and nutrition. The organization also prioritized strengthening local governance by delivering skill mapping and capacity building training to Panchayat Raj Institution (PRI) members and grassroots stakeholders such as SHG representatives, Anganwadi workers, and ASHAs.

Additionally, in collaboration with Manipal Payment and Identity Solutions (MPIS), BVT conducted multiple awareness sessions focusing on financial literacy, decentralized renewable energy (DRE) livelihoods, and skill training—enabling participants to make informed decisions and explore sustainable livelihood avenues.

Through these comprehensive and inclusive initiatives, the Good Governance sector at BVT continues to foster community development, institutional capacity, and individual empowerment, ultimately contributing to a more equitable and resilient rural society.

Awareness Program on Vishwakarma Scheme

Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with the Jnana Chethana National Skill Development Centre, Kota, organized seven awareness programs on the Vishwakarma Scheme across various locations in Udupi District.

The programs aimed to inform and educate artisans, craftsmen, and local communities about the benefits, eligibility, and application process of the Vishwakarma Scheme, which supports traditional skills and promotes self-employment. A total of 380 participants benefitted from these sessions, gaining valuable awareness to leverage the scheme for enhancing their livelihoods.



Entrepreneurship Development Program



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development of Karnataka (CEDOK), organized nine Entrepreneurship Development Programs (EDPs) across various locations in Udupi District.

These programs aimed to foster an entrepreneurial mindset and equip participants with the knowledge and skills required to start and manage small enterprises. Topics included business planning, financial management, marketing strategies, motivational sessions and government schemes for entrepreneurs. A total of 300 participants benefitted from these programs.

Capacity Building Training and Skill Mapping Program for PRIs (Panchayat Raj Institutions) and Local Partners

Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Robosoft Technologies, Udupi, successfully conducted a Training and Capacity Building Program for Panchayat Raj Institution (PRI) members and local partners across six Grama Panchayats in Udupi District — namely Badanidiyoor, Hanehalli, Billadi, Shirva, Padubidiri, and Avarse.

The program aimed to enhance the skills and knowledge of Grama Panchayat members, along with local stakeholders such as Self-Help Group (SHG) representatives, Anganwadi workers, and ASHAs. A total of 246 participants actively took part in the sessions, contributing to strengthened grassroots governance and community engagement.



Awareness Program on Financial Literacy, DRE Livelihoods and Skill Training



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Manipal Payment and Identity Solutions (MPIS), organized 16 awareness programs across various locations in Udupi and Dakshina Kannada Districts. The sessions focused on enhancing knowledge in areas of Financial Literacy, Decentralized Renewable Energy (DRE) Livelihoods, and Skill Training, aiming to empower individuals with the necessary tools to make informed financial decisions and explore sustainable livelihood opportunities.

A total of 643 participants benefitted from these programs, gaining valuable insights and practical guidance to support their personal and professional growth.

Fruit Plant Distribution to Farmers



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Mangalore, organized a Fruit Plant Distribution Program at Grama Panchayat, Harekala.

The initiative aimed to promote sustainable agriculture and encourage fruit cultivation among rural communities. A total of 100 community members benefitted from the program by receiving fruit plants, supporting both nutritional security and livelihood enhancement.

Renewable Energy & Financial Institutions



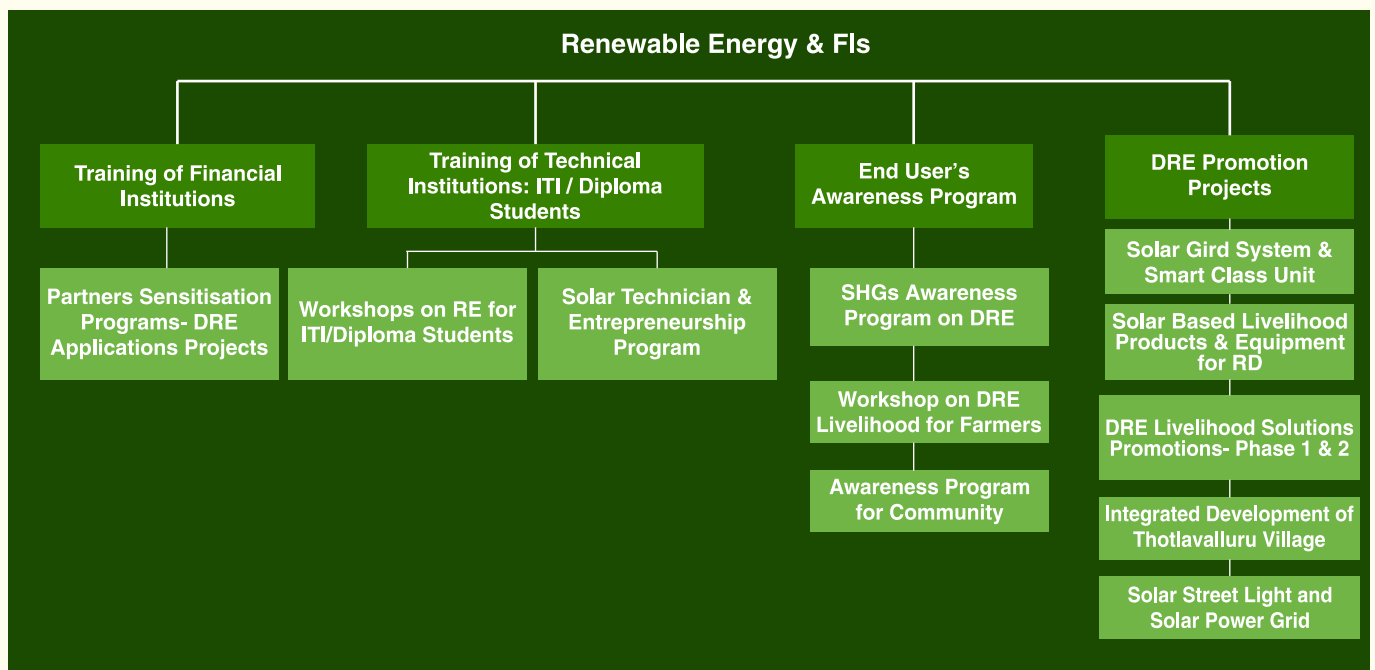
Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with a network of development institutions, has undertaken comprehensive initiatives to promote renewable energy and foster inclusive growth through financial and capacity-building support. These efforts reflect a synergistic approach toward sustainable development, focusing on awareness, education, livelihood promotion, and systemic ecosystem development.

In the Renewable Energy sector, BVT has implemented a wide range of awareness programs, workshops, model projects, and training initiatives. These include community sensitization programs for Self-Help Groups (SHGs), capacity-building workshops for students and technicians, and model interventions such as solar-powered education systems and livelihood equipment distribution. Through decentralized renewable energy (DRE) solutions, communities—particularly women, tribal, and marginalized groups—have been empowered with the knowledge and tools needed for sustainable livelihoods, improved productivity, and enhanced quality of life.

Simultaneously, the role of Financial Institutions has been instrumental in these efforts. Institutions like NABARD, LIC Housing Finance Ltd., and various banks and cooperative societies have partnered with BVT to finance and support renewable energy projects at grassroots levels. Their involvement extends beyond funding—into capacity-building, stakeholder coordination, and facilitating access to government schemes and markets. Through these collaborations, financial inclusion is being effectively integrated into climate action and livelihood development.

Simultaneously, the role of Financial Institutions has been instrumental in these efforts. Activities

Solar Powered Digital Education System



1. Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), under the sponsorship of LIC Housing Finance Ltd has installed 40 Solar Powered Digital Education systems at High Schools of Ramanathapuram district, Tamil Nadu.

This initiative aimed to provide students with access to modern digital learning tools powered by renewable energy, ensuring uninterrupted learning even in areas with power constraints. The project not only enhanced the quality of education through interactive digital content but also promoted the use of clean and sustainable energy in rural schools.

2. Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT) successfully implemented a CSR project sponsored by Gemini Graphics, focusing on enhancing digital learning infrastructure in government schools across Karnataka.

Under this initiative, Solar Powered Digital Education Facilities were established in 25 rural schools in Bidar district and 1 school in Mangalore, Dakshina Kannada district. The project aimed to provide a holistic solution that integrates solar energy with digital classroom tools, creating a sustainable and effective learning environment for students in underserved regions.

3. Under the sponsorship of IIFL Samasta Finance Ltd, BharathiyaTrust (BVT) has successfully implemented a Solar Powered Digital Education System at the Government Higher Primary School (GHPS), Kanchipura, located in Hosadurga Taluk, Chitradurga District.

This initiative aims to bridge the digital divide in rural education by providing reliable access to modern teaching tools, even in areas with limited electricity supply. The solar-powered system ensures uninterrupted learning by harnessing renewable energy, thereby promoting sustainability and environmental awareness among students.

Solar Technician & Entrepreneurship Training Program



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Vijaya Rural Development Foundation (VRDF), organized a three-day Solar Technician and Entrepreneurship Training Program at National ITI College, Herady, Barkur.

The program included both theoretical and practical sessions, covering key topics such as renewable vs. non-renewable energy, solar technologies, and entrepreneurship opportunities in the green energy sector.

A total of 38 students benefitted from this skill-development initiative, aimed at fostering technical expertise and sustainable livelihood opportunities in the renewable energy domain.

NABARD Team visits Harekala Hajabba School



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), with the support of NABARD, implemented a Solar Grid System and Smart Class Unit at HarekalaHajabba School in Harekala, Mangalore, in 2022. This initiative aimed to enhance the learning environment for students by providing reliable lighting and modern digital learning tools.

The project significantly reduced the school's monthly electricity bill from ₹ 3,000/- to just ₹ 150/-, easing its financial burden. The addition of smart classroom facilities improved access to modern, curriculum-related information, which helped in increasing student enrolment and enabled the school to better compete with private institutions.

The school, founded by Padma Shri awardee HarekalaHajabba, has been a beacon of grassroots educational reform. His dedication and efforts to uplift rural education were further strengthened by this project, which is now considered a model initiative in the village.

A team from NABARD, including bank managers from various districts of Karnataka and other states, along with AGMs, visited the school. They interacted with Padma Shri Hajabba, learning about his inspiring journey, and engaged with teachers and students to understand the positive impacts of the project. The team expressed great satisfaction, recognizing it as a successful and replicable model for rural educational development.

Solar-Based Livelihood Products & Equipment for Rural Development



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Aspen Infra Ltd., Padubidri, organized a distribution program at Bantara Sabha Bhavan, Padubidri, to promote solar-powered livelihoods and education.

- As part of the initiative, 20 solar-powered sewing machines were provided to rural women entrepreneurs from Palimaru and Padubidri Gram Panchayats.
- Smart education systems and essential equipment were installed in 3 Anganwadis and 3 schools across the region. Facilities included solar lights, digital classrooms, water purifiers, sports items, and more to enhance rural learning environments.
- Padabettu Temple was also equipped with solar indoor and street lighting, promoting sustainable community infrastructure.

DRE Based Livelihood Solutions Promotion Project: Phase-I

Under this project BVT made an effort to identify, empower, create / support entrepreneurs from diverse marginalized backgrounds in adoption of DRE Solutions into their livelihoods for more viable and sustainability was taken up in Kanyakumari, Tirunelveli and Tenkasi Districts of Tamil Nadu. The project focused on identifying, mapping and shortlisting 110 women entrepreneurs (beneficiaries) for deployment of micro, small and medium sized DRE powered livelihood solutions. This project was sponsored by United Nation Development Program, India.

- Deployment of DRE-based solutions for livelihoods for improved productivity and local entrepreneurship
- Baseline and Needs Assessment to understand various socio-economic aspects, end-user needs and specific energy requirements for their livelihoods. Focused on both qualitative and quantitative insight.
- Identification and shortlisting of 150 potential entrepreneurs (solution end-users) for deployment of micro, small and medium sized DRE powered livelihood solutions.
- Solution design and facilitation of Deployment of 110 DRE based livelihoods solutions- 90 DRE based Sewing machines and 20 DC fridges to Tribal and Transgender communities of the selected districts.

- Non-Govt. Organisation s/ Community Based Organisation – Local active and reputed NGOs and CBOs working with Tribal and TG communities.
- Service provider/ technology partners and experts.
- Organising need-based awareness and skill development programs for developmental partners/ stakeholders of the operational area.
- Organised 4 Partners' sensitisation programs to build the capacities / confidence among about 450 members of various developmental partners and stakeholders in the sector.
- Conducted 35 Partners' beneficiaries' awareness programs and created awareness amongst more than 1500 potential beneficiaries -women, SHG group members, villagers about DRE energy solutions.
- Organized 5 Skill & Livelihood Development /Value Addition Training in apparel sector for more than 120Tribal Women and Transgender for DRE based tailoring activity.
- Organized 4 Boot Camps for 110 end users on Utilization and maintenance including basic operations of solutions, Dons & Don'ts, minimum maintenance, awareness on Backward & Forward supply chains and linkages.



- Organized a Technician cum Service – entrepreneurs Training cum Boot camp at Tirunelveli for creating Service technicians to provide in-time service and maintenance for these beneficiaries on entrepreneurial model.
- Serious efforts made towards Scaling Up, Replicability through Stakeholder Coordination, exploring possibilities for establishing Collaborative Partnerships, / understating /association, Presenting Case-Studies- Impact on real beneficiaries.



DRE Livelihood Solutions Promotion Project: Phase-II

Mitigation Measures to support Inclusive Development and Just Transition in India towards a Net Zero Future (JSB 2023).

Objectives:

The primary objective of this project is to ensure sustainable utilization of the solutions deployed, while building a strong local ecosystem for future business development needs of these individual entrepreneurs. This includes aspects such as

- Strengthening business operations of existing deployments- through trainings and linkages with input and market partners, stakeholders on best practices

Integrated Development of Thotlavalluru village in Krishna district Andhra Pradesh

Under the sponsorship of Mantralee Social Innovation Federation, a significant step towards integrated rural development was undertaken in Thotlavalluru village, Krishna district, Andhra Pradesh. The initiative focused on promoting renewable energy solutions to enhance local infrastructure and sustainability.

With implementation support from BVT, the project successfully installed a Rooftop Inverter System at key public service locations including ZPH Schools Plus in North Valluru and the Primary Health Centre in Thotlavalluru. Additionally, Smart Anganwadi Systems were established at four centres: Jumma Masjid Anganwadi Centre, Gurram Jashuva Anganwadi Centre, Yadava Ramalayam Anganwadi Centre, and Malkapuram Anganwadi Centre in Thotlavalluru village.

These interventions significantly reduced the carbon footprint of the facilities and promoted the use of clean energy, contributing to a greener and more resilient rural community. This project stands as a model of how targeted renewable energy initiatives can support education, health, and early childhood development in rural India.



Solar Street Light & Solar Power Grid

Under the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative of Indoco Remedies Ltd., Mumbai, a significant sustainable energy project was successfully implemented by Bharatiya Vikas Trust (BVT) at Guruprasad High School, Mallapura, located in Honnavara, Uttara Kannada District.

The project involved the installation of a 5Kw Solar Grid Tie System with backup support, aimed at promoting renewable energy usage in rural educational institutions and ensuring uninterrupted power supply. This system enables the school to harness solar energy efficiently, reduce dependency on conventional electricity, and lower operational costs, while also providing a reliable backup to manage power outages, which are common in the region.

Through this intervention, students and faculty now benefit from a more conducive learning environment with continuous power for lights, fans, and educational technology. This initiative not only addresses the immediate power needs of the school but also serves as a live example for students to learn about sustainable practices and renewable energy.



Awareness Program on Solar livelihood and Life styles



Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), Manipal, in collaboration with Manuvikasa NGO, organized an awareness program on solar energy for livelihoods and sustainable lifestyles for fisherwomen at Grama Panchayat, Maravanthe, Baidoor, Udupi District.

The session focused on promoting the use of solar energy in daily life and income-generating activities, aiming to empower women through sustainable and eco-friendly solutions.

A total of 25 women actively participated and benefitted from the program.

Workshop on DRE Livelihoods

Bharathiya Vikas Trust (BVT), in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Mangalore, organized a one-day awareness program on Decentralized Renewable Energy (DRE) Livelihoods at KVK, Mangalore.

The program aimed to educate farmers, youth, and women on the potential of DRE-based livelihood opportunities and promote sustainable income generation through renewable energy solutions.

A total of 45 participants benefitted from the session, gaining valuable insights into integrating clean energy with livelihood development.
